

### Determine Your Three Pastoral Priorities

Next, you affirmed your Five Foundational Ministries.


Together, these two activities help to establish and influence your Three Pastoral Priorities.

These Three Pastoral Priorities will further inform the focus, clarity, and direction of your work in support of your local community. In order to qualify as one of the Three Pastoral Priorities, each priority must meet the following four criteria:

- 1. It is important enough to be on the Pastor's list.
- 2. It is a Parish Leadership Team-level priority.
- 3. It is complex enough that it can't be delegated to one direct report.
- 4. It requires cross-functional support.



# Three Pastoral Priorities: Achieves, Avoids, Improves



It is important to frame your vision with concrete ideas and issues that are rooted specifically in your parish. You can start by generating three lists:

**Achieves:** The **Achieves** list should contain 2-5 new and different things or ministries you would like the parish to do in the future. "New and different" means that the parish is currently not doing these things or ministries.

**Avoids:** The **Avoids** list should contain 2-5 things or ministries they would like to see the parish avoid in the future. These could include past, present, or potential future problems.



**Improves:** The **Improves** list should contain 2-5 things or ministries currently happening in the parish that you would like to either maintain or build upon for the future. These include strengths or current positive happenings in the parish.




