Dear Holy Family Cathedral Parishioners,


As we approach the great Solemnity of Pentecost, the birthday of the Church, I wish to share with you the Three-Year Priority Plan for Holy Family Cathedral.

THE RESULTS ARE IN!

In the Fall of 2019, our parish participated in the Disciple Maker Index, a national survey on parish engagement. More than 250 parishioners responded to the survey, which was conducted by the Catholic Leadership Institute.



The survey had four main desired outcomes; namely to help identify what drives parishioners to:





Recommend their parish to a friend



Grow spiritually as a Catholic



Share their personal witness with another



Progress along their Catholic journey



The results confirmed our belief that Holy Family Cathedral is a strong, dynamic parish and community, filled with folks who are active in their faith.

However, there is still more work to do if we are to achieve our vision of offering every person in our community a lifechanging encounter with Jesus.

We seek then to reach out to all our brothers and sisters with our faith - wherever they may be in their faith journeys - and organically grow the parish. People will enter Holy Family Cathedral feeling welcomed, they will meet other parishioners in the pews and they will leave knowing that there is a place for them here.

600 to 700-750 by May 31, 2023

Goal: 100-120 parishioners demonstrating spiritual growth through participation in at least 1 parish ministry by May 31, 2023

Goal: Move the parish office out of the

rectory by May 31, 2023



FAITH FORMATION - Fostering the Virtue of Faith

From the time we are born, until the time we die we are called to change; we are called to become the best versions of ourselves. As an expression of love for each person, Holy Family Cathedral desires to share our greatest treasure, Jesus Christ. This ongoing conversion after encountering Christ happens as we fill our minds with truth, goodness and beauty.





Goal: Initiate 40-50 first and second grade children annually in the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist in the Restored Order Sacramental Preparation Program by May 31, 2023

Goal: Increase enrollment of students in Holy Family Cathedral School from 100 to 160-180 by May 31, 2023

Goal: Identify 200-230 adults who are demonstrating spiritual growth by engaging in prayer and faith formation activities annually by May 31, 2023

Goal: 100-110 parishioners will be engaged in an hour of Adoration a week by May 31, 2023



OUTREACH- Fostering the Virtue of Charity

As a faith community, to fulfill this part of our mission, we will survey the needs of our brothers and sisters within our community and in the neighborhoods that surround us in order to serve Christ in those in need.

Goal: Serve 300-350 souls in our surrounding community annually who are in need by May 31, 2023

Goal: Initiate 30-40 candidates and catechumens annually through the RCIA program by May 31, 2023

Goal: Accompany 50-60 parishioners on an annual basis who are sick, dying or vulnerable by May 31, 2023
